
Part 2: Peer Exchange Findings / Lessons Learned

- 1. This Peer Exchange was a very valuable activity
- 2. Role of FHWA in Territories has been helpful and is appreciated
- 3. All Territories need additional funding. Interested in knowing all funding opportunities.
- 4. Pacific Territories face constraints on labor/professionals due to visa restrictions and salary constraints.
- 5. Federal regulations regulations and policies need to consider unique challenges of Territories.
- 6. Territories believe federal requirements are challenging and require significant effort to remain compliant.
- 7. Lack of contractors is a constraint and new contractors won't come in until there is some security of long term work.




8. Territories would benefit from clarification on what maintenance/preservation is allowable.






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- Although Territories understand importance of resiliency/vulnerability, due to lack of resources it is not a priority.
- 10. There are opportunities to expand planning and programming activities to establish goals and increase public involvement.
- 11. Water transportation is a critical service for the territories to connect from Island to Island.
- 12. Federal Lands is a good resource both for regular federal aid program, as well as Emergency Response (ER).





Part 3: Potential Action Items / Next Steps

Potential Action Items / Next Steps

Takewood, CO

- Simplify the process to manage and delivery federally funded projects.
- 2. Find opportunities to leverage FHWA resources.
- 3. Focus on improving Territory ability to build coastal resiliency.
- 4. Focus on better managing assets.
- 5. Look for opportunities to form agreements with others.
- 6. Understand available federal grant opportunities.
- 7. Stay engaged:
 - 1. Formalize a group to sustain the peer relationship
 - 2. Establish charter and meet regularly (virtually)
 - 3. Hold targeted webinar training sessions and listening sessions
 - 4. Plan to hold face-to-face event every 3 to 5 years at rotating location



- 1. USTPE provided an **added value** to all the territories.
- 2. In my opinion, clarification regarding Federal legislation applicable to territories is needed:
 - ≥ 23 CFT Highway
 - ▶ 49 CFR Transportation
 - ▶ 2 CFR Uniformity
 - > 29 CFR OSHA



- 3. Preventive maintenance strategies
 - Clarify to what extent crack sealing/pothole routine activities fits in as an eligible funding activities under EDC (i.e. What % of potholes, cracks are eligible?; less than 20%.)



- 4. Incorporate/amend current CFR legislation to address the territorial extraordinary events and made them part of the ordinary intention of the legislators.
- 5. A separate federal publication/guideline that includes all pertinent FHWA territories requirements is needed.



6. NHI courses are available to assist the territories.
